



HISTORIC LANDMARKS OF NORTH PARK

North Park Water Tower

Completed in 1924, it was the largest tower of its kind, rising to 127 feet and holding 1,200,000 gallons of water.



Georgia Street Bridge

Designed by J.R. Comly in 1914, the reinforced concrete Mission Revival Style Bridge made the development of North Park possible.



North Park Theatre

In 1928 the Klicka brothers provided the land and the Quayle brothers provided the design for the Spanish Renaissance multi-use building, where Fox Theatres featured Vaudeville performances and "sound and vision" cinema.



Silvergate Masonic Temple

Built in 1931, this Art Deco masterpiece was designed by the Quayle Bros to resemble King Solomon's Temple and features Egyptian motifs in its meeting and lodge rooms.



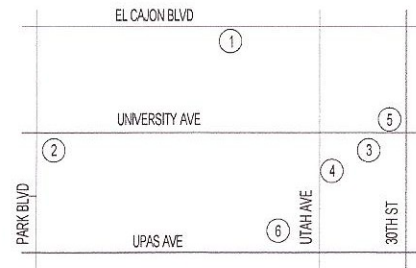
Stevens Building

North Park's first real estate firm of Stevens and Hartley built the first high rise commercial structure at 30th and University in 1912, creating the core of North Park's business center.



David O. Dryden District

Craftsman bungalows designed & built by master craftsman Dryden are located along 28th St & Pershing Ave between Upas and Dwight Sts.
