1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

2. AGENDA REVIEW AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Katherine announced that the Toyland Parade will be Saturday, December 7, 2013 at 11 am. It will be the 50th anniversary of the parade! The group agreed we should be in it. We have marched in the parade as the North Park Historical Society since 2008, when Vince starred as the first Water Tower, his fabulous creation (see photo at right). Katherine will send in the entry form. The fee is \$25, and the route will be the same as last year.

3. MINUTES ACCEPTANCE

The draft minutes from the July 18, 2013 NPHS meeting were accepted and have been posted on the website.

4. TREASURER'S REPORT

The financials were sent to the Board in advance of the meeting. Between mid-July and mid-August 2013 we recorded income of approximately \$340 from sales of 3 North Park history books, 2 car show sponsors, 6 car show registrations, and 2 memberships. Expenses in this time period included \$816 for the car show portapotties (a deal at \$316) and the one-time special scholarship awards of \$250 each to this year's two runner-up Klicka Scholarship applicants.

Update: Regarding our request for a new County Grant to help fund the car show and our Arcadia book preparation, Steve is happy to report we received a grant of \$1,500 and this money is in the bank. We sincerely appreciate the County's support of our activities.

ACTIVITIES PORTION OF MEETING

5. ARCADIA BOOK PROJECT

Update: The Arcadia Book Working Group held its 8th working meeting on the fourth Thursday of the month, August 22, 2013. Melanie reported on her research of the mysterious "Washeteria" photo, which we now know is the groundbreaking for the Beth Jacob synagogue on 30th Street which is now an Armenian church.

We also reviewed some interesting photos of the Toyland Parade from the 1940s that Chris Wray obtained, and some pictures Steve and Katherine have borrowed from the North Park contingent at Grossmont Gardens in La Mesa.

6. WALKING TOURS

Steve conducted a Saturday morning walking tour of Morley Field on August 17 at 9 am. Attendance quadrupled from the tour the previous week! Steve had new information about the architect of the Bud Kearns Swimming Pool registration building, who was a Swiss immigrant named Louis Bodmer. Mr. Bodmer worked under Richard Requa and also designed Spanish Village in central Balboa Park. He lived at 4001 Illinois Street near Lincoln Avenue for 50 years, so was a long-time North Park resident. George and Valerie continue to work on the booklet for the "Streetcar Suburb" tour of the Hamilton-Villa Terrace area.

7. PLANNING BOUNDARIES







George reported on the issue of the University Heights Community Association's request to move the northwest corner of the North Park Community Planning Area (generally the chunk north of Lincoln Avenue and west of Texas Street) into the Uptown Planning Area. He said that City staff explained at a meeting that this issue would be part of the Community Plan update process. Especially considering the mayor's recent resignation, it is not likely this will simply happen without some analysis of potential effects. George will be on the Historic Element committee for the North Park Community Plan update process. Thank you, George!

8. CAR SHOW REPORT

Our biggest event of the year is our 4th Annual North Park Car Show, which was held on September 7 (the first Saturday after Labor Day) from 10 am to 2 pm in the parking lot in front of the tennis courts at Morley Field. We appreciate Balboa Tennis Club hosting us once again.

We want to recognize one more time our \$100 donating sponsors: Babycakes, True North Tavern, Realtor Ron Oster with Ascent Real Estate, Realtor Brian Lacklen with Ascent Real Estate, County of San Diego, Broker Bill Vivian, Randy Sappenfield, and Steve Hon. We also want to recognize our in-kind sponsors. North Park Trophy donated the beautiful trophies. A7D printed the poster designed by Vince. Uptown News published the poster and an excellent front page article. Jim Brady with Brady Architectural Photography took pictures of the cars.
