

**NORTH PARK HISTORICAL SOCIETY
APRIL 2014 MEETING NOTES**

DATE: APRIL 17, 2014

TIME:

The April meeting of the North Park Historical Society (NPHS) Board of Directors unfortunately had to be cancelled because Grace Lutheran Church was holding a special service at the same time as our meeting. These notes summarize information and announcements we intended to share at the meeting.

The next meeting will be **THURSDAY** May 15, 2014 at 6:30 pm in a second floor meeting room at Grace Lutheran Church, 3967 Park Boulevard.

3. MINUTES ACCEPTANCE

The draft minutes from the March 20, 2014 NPHS meeting have been posted on the website.

BUSINESS PORTION OF MEETING

4. TREASURER'S REPORT

The financials were sent to the Board in advance of the meeting. In the period from March 17 to April 13, 2014, four North Park history books and four Burlingame books were sold and four members joined/renewed. A total of 97 senior adults participated in the Burlingame Tour at \$3 each, for a revenue total of \$291. We had expenses of \$45 for updated Quickbooks for our wonderful Treasurer.

5. CREDIT CARD SALES

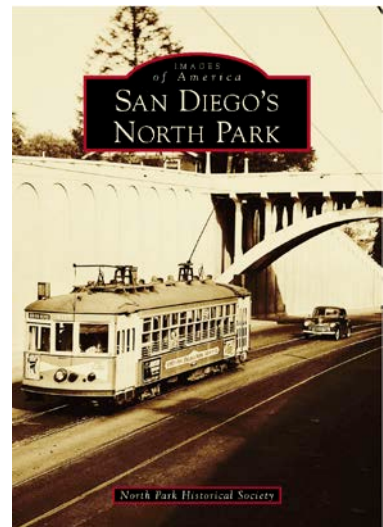
We are considering trying out a mobile phone credit card service so we can sell our books to people who don't have checks or cash with them, but do have plastic. The fee is 2.75% of the sale price. When we sell the *Burlingame* book at \$15, we usually pay sales tax ((\$1.11) out of that (so we don't have to make awkward change). With a credit card sale, we would pay an additional 41 cents as fee. But because we would not have to make change, we could charge the full \$15 plus tax. The fee for the *North Park: A San Diego Urban Village* book, which we sell for \$20 (with \$1.48 in sales tax), would be 55 cents. The Board will need to consider this potential action further.

ACTIVITIES PORTION OF MEETING

6. ARCADIA BOOK PROJECT

Arcadia has notified us that they intend to publish the book the **week of September 8**. This is great timing for holiday sales, and for us to schedule book presentations and signings.

We need to decide how many books we want to buy for NPHS sales. Arcadia offers an author discount of about 40% off of the retail price of \$21.99 for fewer than 200 books. As an example, if we bought 100 books, the discounted price would be about \$12.75 each, and the total with shipping would be about \$1,300. The Board will need to consider this action at a future meeting.



Now that we know which photos will be in the Arcadia book, we need to pay for the rights for the photos from the San Diego History Center. That total payment is \$2,525 for the rights to 101 photos at \$25 each. This expenditure was anticipated in the Annual Budget already approved by the Board. Payment will be made in May to assure that some of the expenditure will qualify for being paid out of County Grant funds.

7. SOHO AWARD FOR WATER TOWER DESIGNATION

Great News! North Park Historical Society, Alex Bevil, University Heights Historical Society, and McKinley Elementary School will receive a Save Our Heritage Organisation (SOHO) People in Preservation Award for the successful designation of the water tower and surrounding water supply facilities on the National Register of Historic Places! The award letter from SOHO said in part:

"The jury was once again greatly impressed by the work of the North Park Historical Society in recognizing the historic resources of the community and acting to protect them. The designation of the North Park Water Tower is a perfect example of this dedication and commitment to North Park's heritage. That you also used the designation as an educational tool for the McKinley Elementary school students takes the project that much further as an advocacy tool. Unlike a beautiful building, the Tower is the sort of cultural resource that can be overlooked by a community; your recognition of the Tower's own unique beauty and significance was both acknowledged and much appreciated by the jury."

This year SOHO has chosen North Park as the focus of their annual Historic Home Tour Weekend, which will be held on June 6, 7 and 8. On Saturday, June 7, NPHS will be conducting multiple walking tours in three different locations:

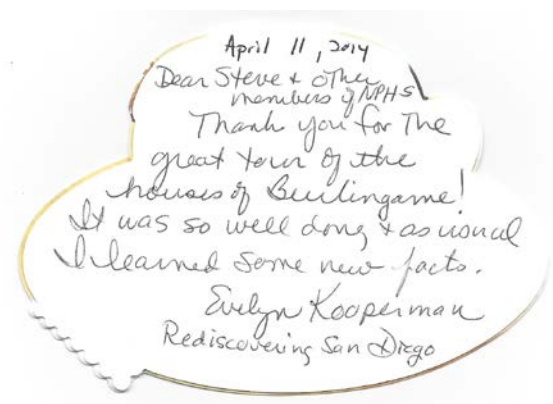
- The Streetcar Suburb at Hamilton Street (**New Tour!** Includes a beautiful color guidebook!)
