NORTH PARK HISTORICAL SOCIETY JUNE 2014 MEETING NOTES

DATE: JUNE 19, 2014 TIME: 6:30 PM

The first part of this meeting was a Business Meeting of the North Park Historical Society (NPHS) Board of Directors, and the second part was the activities discussion for the organization. These notes include updates as of July 10, 2014.

The next meeting will be **THURSDAY** July 17, 2014 at 6:30 pm in a second floor meeting room at Grace Lutheran Church, 3967 Park Boulevard.

1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

2. AGENDA REVIEW AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Maura announced that a private group of history enthusiasts is developing a spring weekend celebration in Balboa Park to help mark the Centennial of the 1915 Exposition. The celebration is planned for April 11 and 12, 2015. Some of the concepts are to have vintage dancers, concerts, bands, Electriquettes for hire, and stations with information about the different neighborhoods of the time, for example, Hillcrest, North Park, South Park, University Heights, and Mission Hills. NPHS may have a booth at this event if it all comes together. Maura will keep us informed about their progress.

Katherine announced that Taylor Bazley, a former Klicka Scholarship winner, graduated from the University of California Los Angeles this year with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. Although the Klicka family is no longer sponsoring the scholarship NPHS was helping to coordinate, it is nice to know one of the student winners has successfully graduated.

Steve announced that he presented the NPHS request for a grant to the County Board of Supervisors. The presentation was limited to a 2-minute verbal discussion, as there are many groups requesting funding. Katherine developed a one-page handout which was provided to the Supervisors at the presentation. This handout was shown to the group and is included at the end of these meeting notes.

Paul announced that the City is enforcing a new policy that as of August 1, RVs and other large vehicles illegally parked for too long will be cited.

3. MINUTES ACCEPTANCE

The draft minutes from the May 15, 2014 NPHS meeting have been posted on the website.

BUSINESS PORTION OF MEETING

4. TREASURER'S REPORT

The financials were sent to the Board in advance of the meeting. In the period from May 12 to June 15, 2014, 7 North Park history books, 3 Burlingame books, 11 tour booklets, and 2 tee shirts were sold. We also gained three new members (including Atlas Footing Repair), three car show sponsors, and six more car entries for total income of more than \$600. Expenses included \$1,056 for renewing our insurance. Showing as an expense is the donation of a spiral bound NPHS Meeting Notes 6-19-14

North Park history book to Jefferson Elementary School. Katherine noted that we have sold about 2,400 North Park history books since 2007 when it was first published.

5. CREDIT CARDS THROUGH SQUARE

In email communication, the Board approved trying a mobile phone credit card service through Square so we can sell our books to people who don't have checks or cash with them, but do have plastic. The Square service has been working out well. Square directly credits the NPHS checking account with the net sales transaction. Square sends a confirmation email showing the total sales price upon the "swipe" and a second email showing the net deposit in the bank. Steve forwards these emails to Sharon for entry in the NPHS Quickbooks records. At the Old House Fair, we gained a membership and sold a Burlingame book with Square.

ACTIVITIES PORTION OF MEETING

6. ARCADIA BOOK PROJECT

Arcadia has notified us that they intend to publish the book the **week of September 8**. Before September 1, we need to tell Arcadia how many books we as NPHS want to buy at a discount to sell directly to individuals and at our own events. The discounted price NPHS as the author will pay for books from Arcadia depends on how many we order, but it will roughly be about \$12.75 each. Note that NPHS is not the publisher of the Arcadia book like we are for the original North Park history book and Burlingame book. By contract, NPHS is not allowed to sell the Arcadia book to other retailers such as SOHO, the Grove, or the San Diego History Center. So we need to think carefully about how many Arcadia books to order. It would help a lot to know how many books our members want to buy from NPHS directly. The total price will be the same as retail: \$23.75 including sales tax (which NPHS has to pay when we sell directly). Katherine will send out an email to our membership soon to compile a list of who wants to buy the Arcadia book directly from NPHS and how many. Keep in mind—it will be a great Christmas present!

San Diego History Center wants to be one of the first to host a book launch event, and would like us to conduct a walking tour constructed around the Arcadia book. That will be in September or early October, so we need to think about an appropriate route and content for a walking tour. We also will need to develop a PowerPoint presentation.

University Heights Historical Society has offered to host a book launch event.

7. NPHS COLLABORATION WITH SOHO

SOHO's annual Historic Home Weekend on June 6, 7 and 8 was highly successful for the Saturday, June 7 walking tours conducted by NPHS. We garnered \$2,035 in walking tour proceeds! We had great attendance for all nine of the tours (three each for Hamilton, Dryden, and Morley Field). Many thanks to our guides George, Steve, Don, Michael, and Katherine, and to all the helpers, including Sharon, Hilda, Jody, Robert, Paul, Maura, Ed, Bob, and Randy. Hilda noted on the popular Hamilton tour that it would be great to be able to get inside the gated bungalow court, as people like being in a place that is normally not accessible.

Charles thought the tours tied in seamlessly with the rest of the SOHO weekend and were the right length. Maura agreed the walking tours tied in great with the houses open on Sunday.

11. 2014 CAR SHOW

We are encouraging sponsors and car exhibitors for our Fifth Annual North Park Car Show, which will be held September 6 (the first Saturday after Labor Day) from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the parking lot along the tennis courts at Morley Field. We are happy to be hosted by the Balboa Tennis Club again. More good news, the restaurant Cardamom Cafe and Bakery just opened an auxiliary cafe at the tennis club, replacing Babycakes. Vince is working on the poster. As of July 10 we have 15 car entries, and are aiming for around 60.

12. NEW OCCASIONAL AWARD


Steve raised the possibility of creating a "Phoenix" award for a community improvement that is outstanding. He used the example of Margaret Walter, who has rebuilt her Craftsman home at 3612 Pershing Avenue that was destroyed by fire in 2010. The house was originally built in 1917 by Master Builder Edward F. Bryans, and is in the North Park Dryden Historic District. Michael moved and George seconded that we establish a "Rising Phoenix" award to be given when determined appropriate by NPHS, and that we explore some kind of plaque that could be hung on a wall for the award. This was approved unanimously by Board members present. Steve will explore a plaque with Dutch at North Park Trophy, who has been a faithful car show in-kind sponsor providing wonderful trophies at no cost, so it would be nice to give him some paid business. Steve will report back to the group.

13. OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Hilda announced that the San Diego Museum of Art has an outstanding exhibit of early 20th Century paintings by the Spanish artist Joaquin Sorolla, and she would be happy to conduct a guided tour of the exhibit. 




